

## **UPDATED MAY 24, 2021**

### **PROJECT OVERVIEW**

The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) District Seven is utilizing the Alternative Corridor Evaluation (ACE) process to evaluate the extension of State Road (SR) 56 from US 301/SR 41 to US 98/SR 35/SR 700 in Pasco County, Florida. The intent is to find a suitable corridor for the extension of the existing SR 54/SR 56 facility, which currently stretches from US 19 to the intersection with US 301/Gall Boulevard/SR 41. This extension of the corridor could complete a direct eastwest route across the southern portion of Pasco County into Polk County and could also serve as part of a bypass for the City of Zephyrhills. The goals of the ACE process are to identify and evaluate alternative corridors, eliminate alternative corridors that do not meet the project's purpose and need or that have disproportionate and/or significant impacts to the surrounding environment, and to recommend a reasonable alternative corridor(s) for further study in the Project Development and Environment (PD&E) phase. This project is being coordinated with the City of Zephyrhills, Pasco County, project stakeholders and the public.



## **ACTIVITIES COMPLETED TO DATE**

- A Kickoff Meeting was held on August 13, 2019 for elected officials, agency representatives, and other interested parties. An overview of the study process and project schedule was presented.
- A Methodology Memorandum (MM) was approved in October 2020. The MM documents the process utilized to develop and evaluate alternative corridors.
- An Existing Conditions Report (ECR) was approved in May 2020. The ECR documents the current conditions within the study area and the engineering and environmental factors used in the corridor evaluation.
- A Draft Alternative Corridor Evaluation Report (ACER) was prepared in April 2021. The ACER documents all aspects of the study including the development and evaluation of alternative corridors, rationale for the recommendation to eliminate or advance alternative corridors, and public involvement activities to date.

## **STUDY RECOMMENDATIONS**

Seven (7) alternative corridors were developed and are shown in the **figure above**. Based on the evaluation of each alternative corridors ability to satisfy the project's stated purpose and need and an evaluation of environmental and engineering factors, Corridors 2A, 2B, 2C, 3A and 3C are recommended for elimination from further analysis. Corridors 1 and 3B are recommended for advancement to further evaluation during the PD&E study. The details of the analysis are documented in the Draft ACER.

#### **WHAT'S NEXT?**

A Public Information Meeting is scheduled for June 15, 2021. The meeting will provide an opportunity to review the alternative corridors and provide your input. We encourage all interested people to participate and express their views regarding the project and information presented. Public comments will be received through July 5, 2021. After the public meeting, comments will be incorporated into the Draft ACER. The Draft ACER will then be provided to the Environmental Technical Advisory Team (ETAT) for review and comment. After inclusion of ETAT comments, the ACER will be submitted to the Office of Environmental Management (OEM) for approval. FDOT will then conduct a Project Development and Environment (PD&E) Study to further analyze the recommended alternatives. The PD&E Study start date is to be determined.
