

Median Modification Project Notification Requirement

Any project on the State Highway System that will divide a state highway or erect median barriers modifying currently available vehicle turning movements or have the effect of closing or modifying an existing access to an abutting property owner, requires a public notification.

The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT), District Seven is proposing installation of raised medians along US 41 (Nebraska Avenue) between Kennedy Blvd. and E. Arctic St.

These will be installed where there are currently stamped pavement median areas.


- In addition to the raised medians, ADA and intersection improvements will be completed at Kennedy Blvd. and Palm Ave. and six mid-block crosswalks will be installed at the following locations:
- E 11th Avenue
- E. Bryan Street
- E. 25th Avenue
- E. Idlewild Avenue
- E. Juneau Street
- E Seward Street




Improvements north of Kennedy Blvd include the addition of sidewalk along the east side of Nebraska avenue and minor widening at the Selmon Expressway on-ramp.




Improvements at Palm Avenue includes restriping the east leg of the intersection to reduce the skewed westbound through movement. It also includes ADA and sidewalk improvements.




Raised medians between Kennedy Blvd. and Palm Ave. are shown here. There are seven proposed locations.




This slide shows the raised median locations between Palm Ave. and E 21st. Ave. There are six proposed locations, along with two proposed midblock crosswalks.




Raised medians between E. 21st Ave. to E. Lake Ave. are shown here. There are seven proposed locations, along with one proposed midblock crosswalk.




This slide shows the raised median locations between E. Lake Ave. and E. Emma Street. There are three proposed locations, two of which are located at E. Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. Boulevard. Additionally, curb extensions will be constructed between E. North Bay Street and E. Genesee Street for traffic calming purposes.




Raised medians between E. Emma St. and E. Hillsborough Ave. are shown here. There are four proposed locations.



This slide shows the raised median locations between E. Hillsborough Ave. and E. Arctic St. There are two proposed locations. There are also two midblock crosswalks proposed within these limits.



The mid-block crosswalks at E 11th Avenue, E. Bryan Street, and E. 25th Avenue will utilize Rectangular Rapid Flashing Beacons — also known as RRFB's. These will alert the motorist that there is pedestrian using the crosswalk.



The mid-block crosswalks at E. Idlewild Avenue, E. Juneau Street, and E Seward Street will utilize Pedestrian Hybrid Beacons – or PHB's. At these locations, the pedestrian will activate a traffic signal that will stop vehicles while the pedestrian safely crosses US 41 (Nebraska Avenue).




The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT), District seven is proposing to modify the median at US 41 (Nebraska Avenue) at E. 124th Avenue in Hillsborough County. The project will provide safety and operational improvements by modifying the existing median and the installation/removal of the necessary signage and pavement markings.
